A landscape-led plan

Green infrastructure

The landscape strategy links streets and homes with Kilbarron Park, the Lika Brook corridor and the wider Boyd Park open-space network.

- Retained and new trees where appropriate
- Native hedges and species-rich planting
- Green corridors that support walking, habitat and drainage

Parks and play

A sequence of usable spaces is proposed for different ages and activities. The detailed design will consider inclusive play, seating, shade, visibility and convenient routes from nearby homes.

- A local play area close to family homes
- Informal recreation lawns and doorstep spaces
- Resting places along walking routes

Water, ecology and long-term care

Sustainable drainage

Rain gardens, planted basins and other sustainable drainage features would help manage surface water while contributing to the character and biodiversity of the neighbourhood.

- Features designed as part of the public realm
- Safe side slopes and suitable planting
- Maintenance access considered from the outset

Management

A landscape management plan would set out establishment, replacement planting, habitat care and responsibilities for maintaining shared spaces over the long term.
